



# A Night to Remember: Mosaic X – Celebrating the Legacy

On a warm Sunday night, March 23, 2025, a group of friends and I attended *Mosaic X: Celebrating the Legacy*, the annual concert showcasing the incredible talent of Harrison College.

It was the first time in decades that I had entered the school hall. I tried to recall my last visit, and it took me all the way back to the early 1970's, when I was in the school play *Miriamy*. The memories came flooding back, and throughout the night, I was overcome with nostalgia.

Music has a magical way of unlocking memories you thought were tucked away forever. For me, *Mosaic X* was a beautiful journey down memory lane — a soulful reunion with the past.

For those unfamiliar with *Mosaic*, as Principal Kaylene Kellman-Holder noted in the programme, “Mosaic has become a cherished tradition, a testament to the incredible talent and dedication within the Harrison College community. For a decade, it has showcased the diverse musical gifts of our students, alumni, and friends, creating a tapestry of harmonies that resonates deeply with all who attend.”

*Mosaic* was born when government funding for the after-school music programme at Harrison College was cut. David Weatherhead — a parent and former student who benefited from the school's music department — refused to let the programme die. Along with other alumni, he conceptualised *Mosaic*, and since then, it has grown from strength to strength, becoming one of the most anticipated concerts in Barbados.

This tenth anniversary show was especially meaningful, as it was held in the school hall — the birthplace of many artistic journeys.

The concert spanned two days, Saturday and Sunday, each with a different lineup. Sunday's programme featured the HC Orchestra, the Harrison College Augmented Orchestra, and a touching tribute to Janice Millington-Robertson and Adrian “Boo” Husbands, with performances by Froggie, Willie, and Gregory. Spoken word artist Adrian Green then captivated the audience with his performance, followed by the legendary *Spice & Co.* — just before intermission, when the *Harrison College Steel Band* brought high energy and rhythm to the stage.






